#### AT HOME LEARNING

We use ordinal numbers, such as first, second, third and so on, when standing in line, playing a game or participating in a race. We also put things in order and think about sequence when we plan a trip or a meal. There are lots of sequencing puzzles, cards and games that your child might enjoy.

- Toy Line: Line up several toys. Which is first? Second? Third? Last? Rearrange them and try again.
- What Happened Next?: Before you go sleep, talk about your day. What was the first thing you did when you woke up? What was the last thing you did before getting into bed? What were some things that happened in between? You can also talk about the sequence of events in a story. What came first? What happened next? What happens last?
